### **NATURAL MATERIALS USED IN PERFORMANCES:**

- <u>Children's play sand</u>: we use non-toxic play sand. This is poured into a bowl in the performance and kept at a slight distance from the audience. Instructions on the sand we use features the following guidance: do not put sand in mouth. If sand comes into contact with eyes, wash out with clean water.
- <u>Mitti Attar:</u> essential oil used in a water spray which is sprayed over the audience. Mitti Attar is a traditional aromatic essence of baked earth hydro distilled into high quality Indian sandalwood.
- Basil Oil:

Heavily diluted essential oil is used in water spray. This is sprayed for the aroma, and won't be sprayed directly at the audience members.

Cornflakes:

There is a choice for participants to feed the puppet 'Bird' in the performance with cornflakes. Comflakes are gently poured into the hand of each participant if permissions is indicated. Ingredients: Milled corn, sugar, malt flavour, contains 2% or less of salt, BHT added to packing for freshness, Vitamins and minerals: Iron, vitamin C (sodium ascorbate, ascorbic acid), Nacinamide, Vitamin B6 (Pryidoxine Hydrochloride), Vitamin B1 (Thiamin Hydrochloride), Vitamin A. May contain Gluten from other Cereals.

Rubber Wellington Boots:

Members of the cast perform a "gumboot" dance in which Wellington boots are worn.

Hessian sacks:

Used as part of the set décor and on the sensory exploration board which is available one hour before performances.

• Feathers:

These are used to decorate our Bord puppet and may be brushed against the skin.
